

MTE and ILO discuss Decent Work agenda

Luiz Marinha received the director of the ILO in Brazil to discuss the topic, one of the priorities of the New Cooperation Framework that will guide the Brazil-UN partnership until 2027



The The Minister of Labor and Employment, Luiz Marinho, received this Monday (16) in his chamber the director of the International Labor Organization office in Brazil, Vinícius Pinheiro. At the hearing, they discussed the decent work agenda, one of the main priorities of the Ministry and the International Organization.

The ILO director highlighted at the meeting the New Brazil-UN Cooperation Framework 2023-2027, signed last August during the visit of the UN Deputy Secretary-General, Amina J. Mhammed, to the country. document to plan, implement and monitor the actions of the UN System in the country, having as reference the Multi-Year Plan and the Strategy Federal Development Policy 2020-2031, allowing the UN system's contribution to Brazil to be complementary and objective to national efforts on the country's main development issues.

The new Framework defined 5 thematic axes: Economic Transformation for Sustainable Development, Social Inclusion for Sustainable Development, Environment and Climate Change for Sustainable Development, Governance and Institutional Capacities and Relationship between humanitarian and Sustainable Development Actions.

The minister defended that it is necessary to "respect the logic of decent work" in all hiring and policies aimed at workers, highlighting the Ministry's efforts in this regard, such as in the policies to combat slavery-like and child labor and also in the various WGs that the ministry has created, with decent work as a non-negotiable premise. It was agreed at the hearing to define a work program between the MTE and ILO, with a decent work agenda as a priority, with a process of understanding already defined with benches and social actors, with the participation of worker and employer entities.

Luiz Marinho meets with the Secretary General of the CSI to discuss the G20 and the "Lula-Biden" global labor partnership

The International Trade Union Confederation is the largest international union federation



The Minister of Labor and Employment, Luiz Marinho, met this Wednesday (18) with the Secretary General of the International Trade Union Confederation (CSI), Luc Triangle, to discuss the Brazilian presidency of the G20 in 2024 and the global labor partnership "Lula-Biden" to promote teaching work.

During the meeting, Luiz Marinho recalled that the Ministry of Labor and Employment is committed to the "Lula-Biden" global labor partnership. "We are in a debate seeking to raise awareness in society in favor of decent work."

Regarding the G20, the minister pointed out that "the pending government will highlight how seriously Brazil treats people and the climate issue, and that President Lula is committed to working in partnership to build a fair world and a sustainable planet".

Luc Triangle thanked the minister for his words and highlighted the importance of Brazil in establishing democracy. "I am grateful for all the people involved in the fight to defend democracy in Brazil. President Lula is a living legend, especially for the trade union movement. We need leadership like Brazil's in our country to be a kind of compass in this complicated moment." Furthermore, the Secretary General offered the CSI as a partner for Brazil.

The confederation is also interested in dialoguing with other ministries, such as the Ministry of Development, Industry and Services and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, in relation to the respective working groups within the GT that deal with the topics of climate change, international trade, investments and commercial agreements.

The CSI is the largest international federation of trade unions and was formed on November 1, 2006, by the merger of the International Confederation of Free Trade Unions and the World Labor Confederation.
